Some of the themes Kent explored:

Even in an increasingly secular society, words like *sacred* (set apart) crop up: sacred right of voting, sacred halls of Congress, for example.

Are any of our ideals "sacred"—set apart, this is better than that?

20 years after 9/11: what questions did the problem of 9/11 raise, and have we been addressing them?

Evolution in consciousness: long ago, sacred was fixed *in a place*. This changed over time.

9/11 was an attack on three real places and symbols: WTC (money), Pentagon (military), Flight 93 - White House? Congress? (power). This was intentional, these places chosen for a reason.

Is the core of our American ideals rooted in money, military, and power? What does America stand for? What's our moral stance in the world?
